The FEMSA Biennial will hold its 14th edition in Michoacán

- The XIV FEMSA Biennial will take place in the cities of Morelia and Pátzcuaro, Michoacán, from February 2020 to February 2021.
- Twenty-four projects by local, national, and international artists will participate, as well as five commissioned curators from Michoacán.
- As part of the Biennial, a showcase of the FEMSA Collection will be held in Michoacán for the first time.
- The program of activities will span a 12-month period.

Mexico City, Mexico. January 14, 2020.- After the successful conclusion of the XIII FEMSA Biennial in Zacatecas, the FEMSA Biennial is solidifying its identity as a traveling platform and launching its fourth edition. Titled *Inestimable Chance*, this edition will be held in the cities of Morelia and Pátzcuaro, in the state of Michoacán, from February 2020 to February 2021.

Inestimable Chance revisits the modern heritage of Morelia and Pátzcuaro, primarily their public art, in the form of murals painted by prominent national and international artists such as Juan O'Gorman, Grace and Marion Greenwood, Alfredo Zalce, and Philip Guston.

These works catalyze our exploration of the three research topics that define the Biennial's programs: realisms, artistic integration, and traditional artistic practices. In this way, the historical reference point of muralism allows us to evaluate and renovate certain artistic attitudes considered essential at the time. For example, the updating of tradition and history, the radical principle of artistic experimentation, fraternal internationalism, free association among friends and creative colleagues, and the concept of chance: the points of convergence among the subjective and the objective, individual ideals and the events of social and material life. This final notion inspired the title for the latest FEMSA Biennial.

The FEMSA Foundation, created in 2008, seeks to create a positive impact on people and communities through sustainability-oriented social investment projects. They do so by focusing on three strategic areas: promoting the efficient management of resources for sustainable development, fostering holistic early childhood development, and sharing Latin American art and culture through the FEMSA Cultural Program, which works with two important initiatives: the FEMSA Collection and the FEMSA Biennial.

With support from the Ministry of Culture, the Michoacán State Ministry of Culture, the municipal governments of Morelia and Pátzcuaro, and the regional representatives of FEMSA companies and other private organizations, the activities of the FEMSA Biennial will be presented in different venues across Morelia, Pátzcuaro, and other cities. Moreover, to foment the participation of institutions, artists, and





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local producers, as well as guest experts and artists, the XIV FEMSA Biennial will offer four closely related programs:

Public Program

For all audiences. This program will take place periodically from February 2020 to February 2021, through talks, workshops, and different activities with distinguished experts and artists in Morelia, Pátzcuaro, and Mexico City. These events will address the key topics of the current FEMSA Biennial: realisms, artistic integration, and traditional artistic practices.

Educational Program

For audiences interested in how exhibitions work, such as students, artists, and museum and gallery employees. This program will take place periodically from February 2020 to February 2021 in Pátzcuaro and Morelia, with a series of activities—a cross between lectures and round-table discussions—with renowned national and international experts. Participation will be managed through open calls.

It will include pieces from the FEMSA Collection, as well as 24 commissioned projects by national and international artists and five commissioned exhibitions by local curators.
